GOLF COURSE COMMITTEE MEETING MARCH 18, 1974

The Golf Course Committee Meeting was held in the Town Hall on March 18, 1974; Chairman Don Brooks called the Meeting to order at 8:40 p.m. All

Members present: Don Brooks, David Canfield, Ray Phelan, Reed Shields, Vincent Paccadolmi and Gino Torcellini

The attached committee report was made by the Policy Committee, resulting from their meeting last Saturday. It is to be studied by Members and will be corrected at the next meeting (NOTE: MARCH 25) and voted on at that time. A letter from Perkin Elmer Corporation was read aloud in this regard. Mr. Paccadolmi suggested several starting time periods be held open each day. There was some discussion of possible community feeling that the \$225 fee might be too high but Mr. Brooks heard little of this at the public meeting last Thursday—always better a little higher and eventual lowering than to make the mistake of setting ones price too low and having to raise it!

PLEASE NOTE AND READ CAREFULLY THE ATTACHED AND PREPARE TO DISCUSS IT AT THE MARCH 25th MEETING.

A discussion followed regarding the hire of a Superintendent and finally a decision was made and the MOTION made:

"THAT the Golf Course Committee recommends to the Selectpersons the hiring of James S. Kaczenski as Superintendent of the Dlhy-Ridge Golf Course, the conditions being that he start at Grade 15, Step #1, being eligible for a bonus after a period of six months subject to our review and that he be given \$150 for moving fees after his acceptance."

Motion made by Ray Phelan, Seconded by David Canfield and voted Unanimously

Ray Phelan found parts for the Worthington, delivered the compressor to them, discovered a good buy (\$300) on an old dump truck, saw to it that the tractor tire was repaired by Firestone, aquired a trailor at the dump which is just what we need with a few minor revisions, and ordered the lumber for the bridge

The following Motion was made by Reed Shields, Seconded by Gino Torcellini and voted unanimously: "THAT we purchase the used truck for \$300."

and also this Motion: "THAT we purchase the F-10 7-gang unit for \$7900" which was also passed unanimously

The Secretary had to leave the Meeting at 10:30 for personal reasons and will have a second page of March 18 minutes in a day or so after receiving information re bills recommended for payment to the Accountant.

Re Industrial Leagues:

\$3 for nine holes only

Request that they start play before 5 p.m. and finish teeing off by 5:30

Minimum of seven foursomes (\$84)

Money collected by the League itself and presented in lump sum to our Pro

We would not guarantee any starting times

Flat fee regardless of 'no shows'

Maximum of 10 foursomes

Each individual would have to identify

himself

We would accept no more than one League each night (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday

and Thursday only.)

Re Outings:

Decision was to entertain them on the basis of accepting a regular greens fee. We would offer them a definite day, or starting time if so desired but we must have two weeks notice to post in the Pro Shop.

An 'outing' is more than ten foursomes.

We will open the Course and beginning on the first weekend offer starting times as follows:

Resident & guest After 9 a.m. Thursdays they can call for times.

On Fridays anyone can call.

7 a.m. - 1:30 p.m., every 10 minutes

No fewer than a foursome will receive guaranteed starting time.

No 'bargain rates' for Town Employees. The matter of student golfers from the high school is being followed through with Principal

Corporations:

\$500 fee would allow two people from the same company to use Corporation Membership; they would be given 100 tickets to be used Monday through Friday, but on weekend or holiday they would have to come with the Corporation Member.
